- 4.) You might think of songs that don't appear on our list. Write them down, as many as comes to mind (title and artist), on a separate sheet of paper. It's possible that we may know some of the songs. The ones that we don't know, we can burn to a disc and play during the breaks.
- 5.) Return the list 2 weeks before day of the affair to address at bottom of contract.

On the other hand, if you don't pick a single song, you can trust our judgment, we know how to read and "work" a crowd.
